August 9, 2022 Pastoral Council meeting highlights

1. Finalized a vision statement for St. Joseph Church.
“St. Joseph Catholic Church seeks to be an actively visible faith community that works to make disciples of Jesus Christ through our hospitality, education, sacraments and service.”
2. Discussed the newly formed greeter ministry; seeking a volunteer to lead it as we transition to Hospitality Ministers and a slight expansion of their roles.
3. Discussed establishing a couple’s group; Fr. Duncan suggested “Teams of Our Lady” as a possible format. www.teamsofourlady.org. Looking for a leader and small committee to get this up and running.
4. Discussed filling 2 Pastoral Council positions with men at the next election in May.
5. Parish picnic update—Tanna & Zach Niemeier are heading up the committee and have set the date as October 2nd in the Fayette City Park.
6. Discussed how our parish currently reaches out to the sick and those in need. Discussed a possible revision of the bulletin listing of the prayer list so it is clearer as to who is from our parish so we can offer help if needed.
