ST. JOSEPH PARISH CAPITAL PROJECTS REPORT – 2021-2022

Because of your generosity and tithing stewardship to our parish, we have been able to complete some much-needed projects to our campus.

PARISH HALL AC/FURNACE – Last summer (2021), we were able to replace the three (3) original AC/furnace units in the Parish Hall. These needed to be replaced because each of them, to some degree or another, had natural gas leaking from them which would have cost a significant amount to repair. After consultation with the Parish Finance Council, the decision was made that it was most prudent to replace them. This project cost us \$27,806 and was completed by Hilgedick's here in town.

WATER DRAINAGE ISSUES For several years, the basement at St Joseph's Catholic Church (in the Education Center) has flooded whenever we had a decent rainfall. A three-phase project-plan was drawn up in the Fall of 2021 to fix this problem. The last phase was completed just this past summer. The first step was to install a more efficient drain system with a sump pump (with battery backup) in the basement floor at a cost of \$8,956.95. The second step was to replace the gutters with larger, commercial-grade gutters and additional downspouts to handle the amount of water that comes off the roofs at a cost of \$7,466.25. The final step was to pipe the water from the downspouts to the road ditch and grade the yard in order to better drain the water away from the buildings into the road ditch at a cost of \$12,642.33. The total cost of the project to protect our buildings from future water damage was \$29,065.53.



Both projects were completed and paid (\$56,870.53) out of our Parish Money Market Account – without having to touch our Diocesan Savings Accounts. This also significantly depleted that on-demand account. If you have any questions or would like to talk about these projects, we'd be happy to go over them further. We are so grateful for your stewardship to be able to make these projects possible. The next Capital Projects that we are looking at for our campus include: (1) a refreshing of the (old Rectory) Educational Center to provide a cleaner and brighter environment for our classrooms and meeting rooms; and (2) renovating the Church bathrooms to make them more handicap (ADA) accessible and quieter when in use. Plans for these projects are in the study-phase of things but know that your tithing stewardship support will help make them possible when we begin work!
