

### **Grateful Living: The Joy of Stewardship, Session 2 Small Groups**

#### PILLAR OF FORMATION

How is learning about God related to stewardship? From what source does God's truth come to us today?

Often, individuals who have attended Catholic elementary or high school, or received the Sacrament of Confirmation, assume their formation has reached a point of completion. Then, at later points in life, they encounter challenges to their faith that are more sophisticated than were appropriate for discussion in an elementary classroom.

Imagine what a simple God we would have—and what an unremarkable plan He would have for us—if a few years of schooling during our youth could sum the whole matter up.

**Adopt a Seminarian**—There are seven young men from our Diocese in the Seminary. In the blue baskets at each entrance are cards with a Seminarian's name, information and address. As you take a card, please keep your Seminarian in your prayers. Send notes of encouragement, cards at birthday, at holidays or just to let him know you are praying for him.

The Human services Council sponsors a **coat closet** in conjunction with the food pantry. They ask for **gently used coats** to have available for anyone in need. They will also accept **blankets**.
