Please contact Father or Parish Secretary at least 6 months before a wedding is planned or as soon as the pregnancy is known so that proper arrangements may be made for the spiritual preparations.

### CORPUS CHRISTI & STEWARDSHIP

How many times have you heard people say, “I don’t get anything out of the Mass”? The truth is that we don’t come to church to get something, but to give ourselves – our whole being --- to God. We have to give ourselves as an offering to God and what we get in return is the presence of Jesus Christ within us. As we come to know Jesus this way, we are drawn into the communion of the Church. Through Holy Communion, we are drawn out of ourselves and embrace the mission of our faith, of our parish. We carry the fire of God’s love within us with the power to renew all things. When we understand the true meaning of the Holy Eucharist, we bridge the gap between liturgy and life, between the love of Jesus on the Cross and our daily lives, between our beautiful theology and practical stewardship. As Eucharistic Catholic Christians, we see the world as God’s gift. We offer the world back to God in thanksgiving, united to His Son, Jesus Christ.

*Gracious and loving God, The Eucharist leads us into a deeper encounter with Your Son, Jesus Christ; Who through the Mystery of His Body and Blood reveals Your active presence in each moment of our lives. May the gift of the Eucharist transform us and give us new meaning. May it make us good stewards of Your abundant blessings and open our hearts to the needs of our Church and to the hunger in the world. Nourish our family of faith; give us wisdom and compassion; and by the power of Your Spirit, show us how to walk in the footsteps of Jesus as we journey together to the peace and joy of Your Divine Love. We ask this through Christ, our Lord. Amen*

**CORPUS CHRISTI (LOCAL) EUCHARISTIC PROCESSION – TODAY after St. Mary 10am Mass.** Today

is the Solemnity of the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ. Originally called Corpus Christi [the Body of Christ], the solemnity had its origins in 13<sup>th</sup>-century France. The feast was extended to the universal Church by Pope Urban IV in 1264. Pope Clement V (d. 1314) and Pope John XXII (d. 1334) formalized the celebrations further. The Church has a rich tradition of holding eucharistic processions and is also an act of public witness – a wonderful opportunity for evangelization with those who may not yet know Jesus or understand our faith. **We are planning on having a Eucharistic Procession today at 11:00 am in Glasgow following the 10:00 Mass. Please join us if you can!**
