STEWARDSHIP PRAYER

Lord God, as we prepare for the transitions of August; of routines becoming regular, signs of schools beginning to emerge, help us to appreciate the sacred rhythms in our lives. A BIBLICAL WALK THROUGH THE MASS – Fr. Duncan will lead this tour of the Mass at St. Joseph and St. Mary. This session is five weeks beginning September 3rd. The process adults take to be initiated into the Catholic faith, known as the **Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults (RCIA)** is now called the **Order of Christian Initiation of Adults (OCIA)**.

This change reflects a closer translation of the process by which adults are initiated into the Catholic faith. This change may not seem like much, but the new name highlights that the process to become Catholic could occur at any point in the year, not just the typical Easter Vigil. For some it could even take multiple years before making the final decision. As *Philip Kosloski puts it*, the process of joining the Catholic Church “involves a period of intense discernment, and prayer, not simply going through the “rites” at fixed points of the year.” If you would like to learn more about the name change you can visit aleteia.org, where this information came from. EMAIL SCAMS – “SPOOFING” -- Email spoofing is becoming all too common these days as a form of cyber-attack. “*Email spoofing is a technique used in spam and phishing attacks to trick users into thinking a message came from a person or entity they either know or can trust. In spoofing attacks, the sender forges email headers so that client software displays the fraudulent sender address, which most users take at face value.*” Priests are often ‘easy’ targets to “spoof” especially with our diocesan email accounts – where it looks like it came from the priest’s email, but when you hit reply, it sends it to a random, different email. If you receive a suspicious email, it is very important that you DO NOT reply to it. (For example, Fr. Duncan will never ask for “emergency help” through an email at 11pm at night) – Feel free to contact the Parish Office if you have any questions or if you think you’ve received a suspicious email.
