STEWARDSHIP PRAYER

Heavenly Father, September is a month that offers hope for things to come: our daily life has a new rhythm, there are new beginnings and a new energy. In this month of accelerating activities, keep us mindful that we live for Christ and not for ourselves, and that to be good stewards of his Gospel should be our goal each and every day. In this month of transition help us find a deeper spiritual balance in our lives that takes time for you and listens to the promptings of your Spirit. We ask this through your Son, Jesus Christ, who lives and reigns with you and the Holy Spirit, God, forever and ever. Amen.

Missouri Catholic Conference Statement on Amendment 3 – *The Missouri Catholic Conference (mocatolic.org), the public policy agency of the state’s four Roman Catholic dioceses, issued the following statement Aug. 13: “Amendment 3, which will appear on Missouri’s November 2024 ballot, is an extreme constitutional amendment that legalizes abortion at any stage of pregnancy with no protections for the preborn child, even when the child is capable of feeling pain. The amendment would effectively repeal long-standing health and safety standards for women. These include basic health and safety requirements for clinics where abortions are performed, requiring a physician to perform abortions, informed consent requirements, laws prohibiting public funding of abortion, and parental consent requirements before a minor’s abortion. The Missouri Catholic Conference will be working to inform the public about this deceptively worded amendment. We urge all Missourians of good will to stand for the health and safety of women and their preborn children and **oppose** Amendment 3.”*

August 20, 2024 - PASTORAL COUNCIL MEETING HIGHLIGHTS

- We discussed in detail the planned adult faith formation opportunities being offered over the next several months, “A Biblical Walk Through the Mass” and “When You Pray”, and the best ways to encourage our parishioners to attend. We generated several ideas for future opportunities including just one-night offering using movies, FORMED and speakers.
- The Diocesan Women’s Retreat is November 1-2 and we discussed ways to encourage women from our parish to attend together so we can grow closer to each other as we grow our faith with other women of faith from across the diocese.
- Establishing a men’s Catholic support group for men of St. Joseph and St. Mary churches was discussed with no conclusions reached at this point. Further discussion is needed.
