STEWARDSHIP PRAYER

Heavenly Father, As we observe Respect Life Month, we are especially mindful of the gift of your Son, Jesus Christ, whose life, ministry, death and resurrection serve to witness Your immeasurable love for us all. May Christ lead us to be good stewards of our brothers and sisters, and to realize that all lives we bring to Him are sacred and deserve to be looked upon in Your image and likeness. Strengthen those who devote their lives to nurturing the most vulnerable, including the sick, the aged, children and those yet to be born. Let their witness give us the courage and resolve to proclaim the Gospel of Life to all whom we encounter. And send your Holy Spirit upon us to give us the wisdom and resolve to be servants of humankind, living icons of Christ, the servant of us all. We ask all this in Jesus' name. Amen.

October is the month we renew our Stewardship with Sunday, October 20th being Stewardship Commitment Sunday. Prayerfully consider what you can offer back to your parish in the four pillars of Stewardship.

- **Hospitality:** “When I was a stranger, you welcomed me.” Matthew 25:35. Christian kindness
- **Prayer:** “Have no anxiety at all, but in everything, by prayer and petition, with thanksgiving, make your requests known to God.” Philippians 4:6. Through prayer, Christian stewards grow closer to God – strengthening their relationship and growing in spirituality.
- **Formation:** “I, the Lord, your God, teach you what is for your good, and lead you on the way you should go.” Isaiah 48:17. Formation involves education for the mind and conversion of the heart.
- **Service:** “As each one has received a gift, use it to serve one another as good stewards of God’s varied grace.” 1 Peter 4:10. Service is giving of one’s time and talent to support the life and ministry of the parish and wider community.

ADULT FAITH FORMATION – “*When we Pray*” Cultivate a rich and lasting prayer life. You know prayer is important but still find it challenging. Perhaps it’s hard to find time, or you’re unsure what to do when you pray. Or maybe you feel discouraged by your weaknesses and your inability to overcome them, you are not alone.
