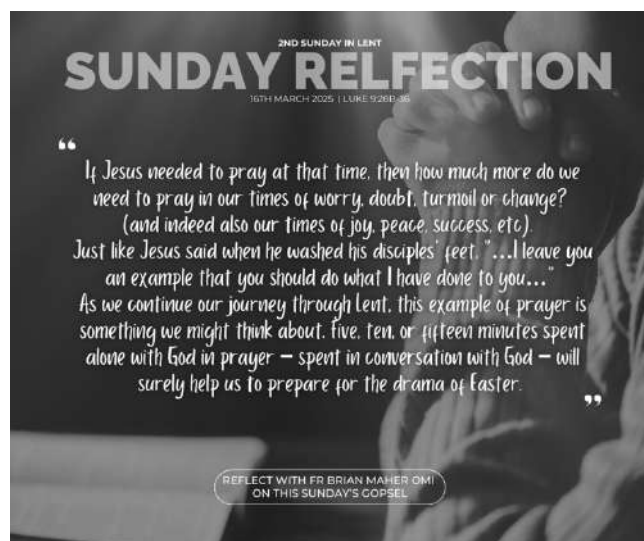
LENT STEWARDSHIP PRAYER

Encountering the Word

with Jeff Cavins

Second Sunday of Lent (C)

Genesis 15:5–12, 17–18 • Philippians 3:17–4:1 or 3:2–4:1 • Luke 9:28b–36



Embrace Your Transformation at Mass!

Isn't it exciting how our readings this Sunday talk about change and transformation? If you're like me, you're always looking for positive change in your life. Let's start with Abraham's story in Genesis 15. God made three promises to Abraham, but Abraham struggled to see how these would manifest in his life. Have you ever felt that way about God's promises?

When God promised Abraham a son, Abraham couldn't imagine it happening because of his older age. But God took him outside and said, "Look toward heaven and count the stars, if you are able." And here's the kicker: When God asked the question, it was likely daytime! Abraham couldn't see the stars, but he believed God anyway, and it was counted to him as righteousness. That's faith, folks!

Moving to St. Paul's Letter to the Philippians, we are promised that Christ will transform our bodies one day. Then, in Luke's Gospel, we witness the incredible Transfiguration on Mount Tabor. Jesus, shining in glory, discusses his "exodus" with Moses and Elijah—meaning his upcoming sacrifice in Jerusalem as the Paschal Lamb.

This brings me to my main point: Our greatest transformation happens through active participation in the Mass. In both the Liturgy of the Word and the Liturgy of the Eucharist, God changes not just bread and wine into the Body and Blood of Our Lord, but he changes our very lives. This Lent, I encourage you to dive deeper into Scripture and to fully engage in the Mass. Let's allow God to work his transformative power in our lives, just as he did for Abraham and the disciples on that mountaintop.

Live the Gospel

Jeff Cavins says, "During this transformative season of Lent, I encourage you to arrive at Mass ten minutes early each Sunday. Use this time to read the Scripture passages for the day to help prepare your heart to be transformed by the Word and the Eucharist. This will help you become a better person of faith. Trust me, it will make a world of difference!"

Encountering THE SEASON

Lent for the Family

Second Sunday of Lent (C)

Genesis 15:5–12, 17–18
Philippians 3:17–4:1 or 3:20–4:1
Luke 9:28b–36

Dear Family:

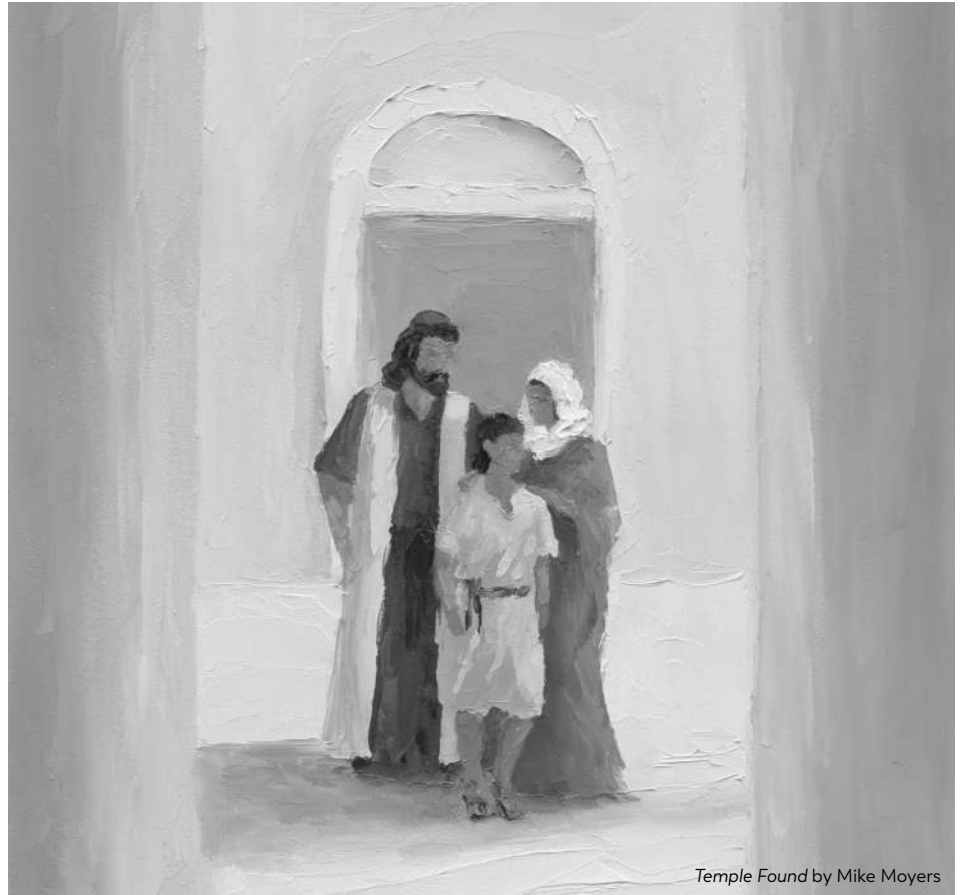
This week, reflect on the theme of *endurance* as we continue our journey with Jesus and Mary. Explore the reflection questions in the “Ponder and Pray” section, and take on the challenges in the “Live It” section. Engage with your family through the activity provided, and spend time in the *visio divina* prayer as we reflect on suffering and compassion.

Enduring Suffering with Jesus and Mary

As we enter Lent’s second week, we continue walking with Jesus on his journey to Jerusalem. In the Good Samaritan parable (see Luke 10:30–37), Jesus teaches us the power of compassion—the willingness to suffer with others. The Samaritan does not pass by the suffering man; instead, he draws near, binds his wounds, and carries him to safety. In the same way, Jesus steps into our suffering, bringing us healing and mercy.

Now, be with Mary as she quietly watches Jesus teach this parable. Her eyes, filled with tenderness, reflect the deep compassion she holds for all who suffer. As you sit beside her, you sense her strength and calm, even as she contemplates the suffering her Son will endure. The road ahead seems

impossible, but Mary endures, her trust unwavering.

Mary, who witnessed Jesus’ life from the beginning, understands suffering intimately. From Simeon’s prophecy in the Temple to the flight into Egypt, she carried the weight of knowing her son’s mission and the suffering it would entail. As we endure our trials, Mary walks with us, showing us how to remain close to Jesus in the face of pain. She reminds us God always works through suffering, drawing us closer to him.

This Lent, as you face your own struggles or witness the pain of others, remember Mary’s strength and endurance. Let her example of compassion and trust guide you to Jesus, who stays with us in our suffering, inviting us to endure with him on the road to redemption.

Ponder and Pray

- As you reflect on Mary’s quiet strength, can you invite her to help you endure difficulties?
- When do you resist seeking God in moments of suffering? Can you ask for the grace to surrender to him during Lent?
- Imagine walking with Mary on the road to Jerusalem. What does her presence in your own spiritual journey reveal about how to endure hardships with faith and trust?

Live It

This week, reflect on the call to endure suffering—whether in your own life or in the lives of those around you. Like Mary, do not shy away from the pain. Instead, offer it to God in prayer, asking for the strength to endure and for the grace to show compassion. As you continue your Lenten practices, remember that each small sacrifice is an opportunity to endure with Jesus on the road to redemption.

Visio Divina

Spend time reflecting on the image of *Temple Found*. In this scene, Mary and Joseph, after days of searching, find young Jesus speaking in the Temple. As you reflect, imagine Mary’s mix of emotions—her relief at finding her son and her awe at witnessing his divine wisdom.

Question 1:

What emotions arise within you as you contemplate Mary and Joseph’s reaction to finding Jesus in the Temple?

Question 2:

How does this image speak to your own spiritual journey of seeking and “finding” Jesus in unexpected places?

Question 3:

In what ways can you, like Mary, remain patient and trusting, even in moments of confusion or uncertainty?

Fun for the Family

As a family, participate in an act of compassion. Choose a way to serve someone who may be experiencing difficulty, whether through a kind gesture, volunteering, or offering a prayer. Discuss how the act of serving someone else helps you grow in compassion and endurance.

THE FREEDOM OF FORGIVENESS

Since your previous Confession, the weeks turned into months, and then months to a year, and then a year into five years ... and now you can't even remember what to do or say.

Some stay away from Confession because they feel awkward, maybe partly because of their sins or because they simply don't know what to do anymore in this sacrament.

At Mass, it is fairly easy to follow along and blend in with the congregation, but Confession can seem like an intimidating "solo" performance. But fear of forgetting some words should never keep you from the freedom of forgiveness!

Welcome Back!

Remember: You are not on your own in Confession. The priest is there to help you. One man shared that when he returned to Confession after a decade, he braced himself for a reprimand from the priest for being away from the sacrament for so long. Much to his surprise, the priest warmly said, "Welcome back!" Then he gently guided the man through the steps that he had long forgotten.

Priests look forward to welcoming people back to Confession after long periods away. As one priest told us, "They are my big fish. They remind me of why I became a priest in the first place."

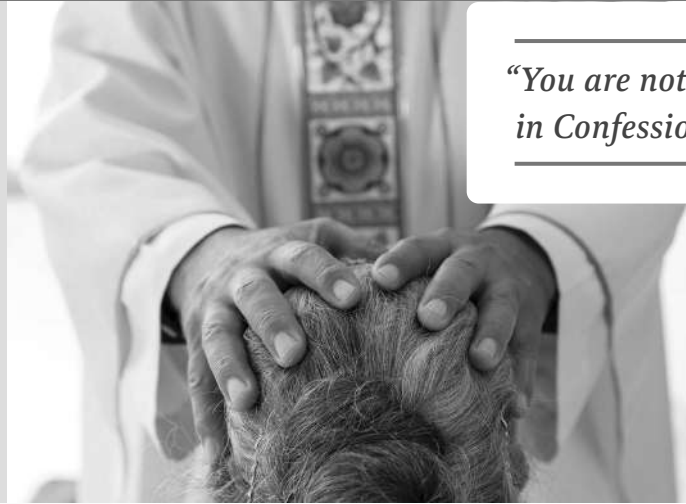


Jesus Wants to Heal Us
